Message from the Director

Dear Friend,

The Peace Action Education Fund (PAEF) works for the global elimination of nuclear weapons, an end to the conventional arms trade, and cutting military spending in order to address human needs. While this voting record is only a snapshot of one year, 2001, you can see who voted to support those aims and who did not.

One vote sticks out, of course, the one that authorized war in response to the horror perpetrated last September 11. One member of Congress, Rep. Barbara Lee of California, voted against it. Perhaps others would have considered alternatives to rushing into an open-ended war had the vote not been scheduled just three days after September 11, when most of the nation was still in shock. That path was not taken, and the consequences will be with us for years to come.

This voting record probably looks a lot like those of the early 1980s. Then, as now, a president new in office was able to push his military program through a mostly deferential Congress. In just a few years, however, it became clear that the public did not support Ronald Reagan's military buildup, and the peace movement successfully mobilized to turn the tide toward nuclear arms reductions.

If the past is indeed prologue, then the challenge before us is clear. We must articulate and build grassroots support for real solutions for a safer world: support for the force of law, not the law of force; rapid progress towards nuclear and conventional disarmament; a foreign policy reflecting American values of democracy, human rights, social and economic justice. Communicating with your members of Congress is a good place to start.

This voting record is a powerful tool for educating the public, and for holding members of Congress accountable. Use it well!

Key Senate Votes

(1) Supplemental Appropriations/ AIDS Funding

Byrd, D-WV, motion to table (kill) the Feingold, D-WI, Amendment that would increase the amount provided in the bill for a US contribution to a global trust fund to combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and tuberculosis by \$593 million. This allocation would be offset by cutting \$594 million from funds appropriated to the Navy for the V-22 Osprey aircraft program. Motion agreed to 79-20: R 46-2; D 33-17; I 0-1. July 10, 2001. Vote #225. **A vote no is a (+).**

(2) Fiscal 2002 Defense Authorization/Base Closures

Warner, R-VA, motion to table (kill) the Bunning, R-KY., amendment that would strike the provision in the bill which authorizes an additional round of base realignment and closures in 2003. Motion agreed to 53-47: R 21-28; D 31-19; I 1-0. Sept. 25, 2001 Vote # 286. **A vote yes is (+).**

(3) Fiscal 2002 Budget Resolution/ Defense Spending

Warner, R-VA, amendment to the Domenci, R-NM, substitute amendment. The Warner amendment would provide for



an increase of \$8.5 billion for national defense spending in fiscal 2002. Adopted 84-16: R 48-2; D 36-14; I 0-0. April 4, 2001. Vote #72. **A vote no is a (+).**

(4) Fiscal 2002 Defense Appropriations/ International Criminal Court

Helms, R-NC, amendment that would prohibit any US cooperation with the International Criminal Court except for assistance to defend US or allied citizens. It also would prohibit the transfer of intelligence or law enforcement information to the court, or to any government that is a party to the court. Adopted 78-21: R 46-3; D 32-18; I 0-0. Dec. 7, 2001. Vote #359. **A vote no is a (+).**

(5) Use of Force Authorization/ Passage

Passage of the joint resolution that would authorize the president to use all necessary and appropriate force against the nations, organizations or people that he determines planned, authorized, committed

or aided the terrorist attacks that occurred on Sept. 11, 2001, or that harbored such organizations or people, to prevent future acts of terrorism against the United States. Passed 98-0: R 47-0; D 50-0; I 1-0. Sept. 14, 2001. Vote # 281. **A vote no is a (+).**

(6) Anti-Terrorism Authority/Passage

Passage of the bill that would expand law enforcement's power to investigate suspected terrorists. The bill would allow disclosure of wiretap information among certain government officials, authorize limited disclosure of secret grand jury information to certain government officials, and allow the detention of foreigners suspected of having ties to terrorism. It also would make it easier for law enforcement to track voice and Internet communications using surveillance techniques and would strengthen laws to combat money laundering. Most of the bill's intelligence-gathering provisions would sunset after four years. Passed (thus

cleared for the President) 98-1: R 49-0; D 48-1; I 1-0. October 25, 2001. A "yea" was a vote in support of the president's position. Vote #313. **A vote no is a (+).**

(7) Andean counter-drug initiative

Graham, D-FL, motion to consider an amendment to the Fiscal Year 2002 Foreign Operations Appropriations bill that would increase funding for the Andean Regional Counter-Narcotics Initiative from \$567 million to \$731 million (including substantial military aid). Motion rejected 27-72: R 13-35 ; D 14-36; I 0-1. October 24, 2001 A three-fifths majority vote (60) of the total Senate is required to waive the Budget Act. Vote # 311. **A vote no is a (+).**

Key House Votes

(1) Budget Resolution/ Kucinich Substitute

Kucinich, D-OH, substitute amendment on behalf of the Congressional Progressive Caucus that calls for using one-third of the available on-budget surplus over 10 years for reducing the public debt, one-third for cutting taxes, and one-third for increasing non-defense discretionary spending, especially in the areas of education and health care. The amendment would cut proposed fiscal 2002 defense spending by \$66 billion. Rejected 79-343: R 0-217; D 78-125; I 1-1. March 29, 2001. Vote # 66. **A vote yes is a (+).**

(2) Jets for Pentagon Officials

DeFazio, D-OR, amendment to Defense Appropriations for 2001. It would cut by \$24.5 million the Air Force Operation and Maintenance account designated for the purchase of 8 luxury 737 jets for Pentagon admirals and generals. Rejected 50-376: R 4-213; D 45-162; I 1-1. June 20, 2001. Vote # 172. **A vote yes is a (+).**

(3) Decrease in Nuclear Weapons Spending

Hinchee, D-NY, amendment that would increase by \$50 million renewable alternative



energy programs at the Energy Department and offset the cost with a decrease by \$60 million for weapons activities from the National Nuclear Security Administration Stockpile Stewardship program. Rejected 163-258: R 18-192; D 144-65; I 1-1. June 28, 2001. Vote # 201. **A vote yes is a (+).**

(4) Increase in Non-Proliferation Spending

Kucinich, D-OH, amendment that would increase by \$66 million nuclear non-proliferation activities and decrease by \$122.5 million funding for the National Ignition Facility. Rejected 91-331: R 8-202; D 82-128; I 1-1. June 28, 2001. Vote # 202. **A vote yes is (+).**

(5) Anti-Terrorism Authority/Passage

Passage of the bill that would expand law enforcement's power to investigate suspected terrorists. The bill would allow disclosure of wiretap information among certain government officials, authorize limited disclosure of secret grand jury information

to certain government officials, and authorize the attorney general to detain foreigners he suspects are tied to terrorism. It would also make it easier for law enforcement to track Internet communications using surveillance techniques. The surveillance provisions would sunset after three years, with a two-year extension if the president finds that the national interest requires it. Most other provisions would expire in 2006. Passed 337-79: R 207-3; D 129-75; I 1-1. A "yea" was a vote in support of the president's position. Oct. 12, 2001. Vote # 386. **A vote no is a (+).**

(6) Use of Force Authorization/ Passage

Passage of the joint resolution that would authorize the president to use all necessary and appropriate force against the nations, organizations or people that he determines planned, authorized, committed or aided the terrorist attacks that occurred on Sept. 11, 2001. The use of force is also granted against States that harbored such organizations or people. Passed 420-

1: R 214-0; D 204-1; I 2-0. (Under a unanimous consent agreement, the House subsequently passed an identical Senate-passed resolution (SJ Res 23) clearing the measure for the president.) Sept. 14, 2001. Vote # 342. **A vote no is a (+).**

(7) Spending Decrease for Andean Counterdrug Initiative

Lee, D-CA, amendment that would increase the US contribution to the Child Survival and Health Programs Fund by \$60 million to fight HIV/AIDS, malaria and tuberculosis, and reduce the Andean Counterdrug Initiative by \$38 million and foreign military financing by \$22 million. Rejected 188-240; R 15-204; D 172-35; I 1-1. July 24, 2001. Vote # 262. **A vote yes is (+).**

(8) ESEA Reauthorization/ Military Recruitment Visits

Vitter, R-LA, amendment that would require secondary schools receiving federal funding to allow military recruiting visits on school grounds. Adopted 366-57: R 215-2; D 150-54; I 1-1. May 22, 2001. Vote # 133. **A vote no is a (+).**
