Message from the Director

There is an old saw about there being two things you don't want to watch being made – sausage and legislation.

This was particularly true about Peace Action's most significant legislative victory last year (one of our most significant in years, really) – the cutting of almost all funding for the Bush Administration's new, "more usable" nuclear weapons programs, in last year's budget.

You won't find this vote in our 2004 Congressional Voting Record, because there was no formal recorded vote taken. The decision to delete nearly all funding for four programs – Robust Nuclear Earth Penetrator ("bunker buster"), Advanced Concepts (which could open the door to so-called "mini-nukes" that would not be all that small), Enhanced Test Site Readiness (to shorten the length of time needed to resume full-scale nuclear testing in Nevada) and Modern Pit Facility (to produce new plutonium for warheads) – was worked out in the catch-all, "omnibus" spending bill at the end of the year by the lame duck Congress.

Even though there were no recorded votes on these programs, our advocacy of nuclear sanity made a huge difference in the final decision to cut the funding.

What you will find in this voting record are the votes of every Member of Congress in 2004 on crucial war and peace issues – nuclear weapons, Star Wars "missile defense", nuclear non-proliferation, the Iraq occupation, military recruiting, the International Criminal Court, and torture.

Please communicate with your Members of Congress to let them know how you feel about their votes, and how you expect them to vote on key peace, disarmament and foreign policy issues in 2005. Also, feel free to distribute this information to friends, neighbors, family members and colleagues who share your thirst for peace and social justice.

Key Senate Votes

1. 2005 Defense Authorization Act/Nuclear Weapons

Kennedy, D-Mass., amendment that would prohibit the use of \$36.6 million authorized in the underlying bill for two Energy Department programs: a study of Robust Nuclear Earth Penetrator “bunker buster” weapons and a Stockpile Services Advanced Concepts Initiative, which includes research into a “low yield” nuclear weapons. Rejected 42-55: R 1-50; D 41-5; I 0-0. June 15, 2004. Vote #113.

A vote yes is a (+).

2. 2005 Defense Authorization Act/Military Interrogations

Warner, R-Va., motion to table (kill) the Dodd, D-Conn., amendment that would prohibit the use of private contractors to conduct prisoner interrogations at U.S. military facilities. Motion agreed to 54-43: R 51-0; D 3-42; I 0-1. June 16, 2004. Vote #118.

A vote no is a (+).

3. 2005 Defense Authorization Act/Missile Defense

Boxer, D-Calif., amendment that would provide that the ground-based midcourse defense element of the national ballistic missile defense system cannot be deployed for initial defensive operations until the Defense secretary certifies that the capabilities of the

system to perform its defense mission have been confirmed by operationally realistic testing of the system. Rejected 42-57: R 1-50; D 40-7; I 1-0. June 17, 2004. Vote #124.

A vote yes is a (+).

4. 2005 Defense Authorization Act/Missile Defense

Levin, D-Mich., amendment that would shift \$515.5 million in the bill from the Missile Defense Agency’s ground-based midcourse interceptors to nuclear nonproliferation programs and other homeland security and anti-terrorism activities. Rejected 44-56: R 0-51; D 43-5; I 1-0. June 22, 2004. Vote #133.

A vote yes is a (+).

5. 2005 Defense Authorization Act/Iraq Reports

Kennedy, D-Mass., amendment that would require that no later than 30 days after the bill’s enactment the president submit an unclassified report to Congress on the strategy of the United States regarding stabilization and rebuilding in Iraq, an estimate on the number of U.S. troops that will be serving in Iraq as of Dec. 31, 2005, and the percentage of such forces that will be members of the National Guard and Army Reserves. Rejected 48-50: R 2-48; D 45-2; I 1-0. June 23, 2004. Vote #138.

A vote yes is a (+).

6. 2005 Defense Authorization Act/Missile Defense

Reed, D-R.I., amendment that would condition \$550.5 million of the Missile Defense Agency’s request for ground-based midcourse interceptors on certification by the Operational Test and Evaluation office that the system is effective and suitable for combat. Rejected 45-53: R 0-50; D 44-3; I 1-0. June 23, 2004. Vote #139.

A vote yes is a (+).

7. 2005 Defense Authorization Act/Troop Limit

Byrd, D-W.Va., amendment that would cap the number of military troops and civilian contractors in Columbia at 500 each. Rejected 40-58: R 1-49; D 38-9; I 1-0. June 23, 2004. Vote #140.

A vote yes is a (+).

8. 2005 Defense Authorization Act/Prisoner Reports

Leahy, D-Vt., amendment to the Leahy amendment. The amendment would direct the attorney general to submit to the Judiciary Committee all documents in the possession of the Justice Department produced since Jan. 20, 2001, regarding the treatment and interrogation of detainees held in U.S. custody. Rejected 46-50: R 0-49; D 45-1; I 1-0. June 23, 2004. Vote #144.

Key House Votes

1. Access for Military Recruiters/Passage

Passage of the bill that would prohibit universities that bar access to Reserve Officer Training Corps or military recruiters from receiving certain federal funding. Schools that receive federal funding would be required to provide military recruiters the same access to students as they offer other groups. Passed 343-81; R 220-2; D 123-78; I 0-1. March 30, 2004. Vote #101.

A vote no is a (+).

2. 2005 Defense Authorization/Nuclear Bunker Busters

Tauscher, D-Calif., amendment that would transfer \$36.6 million from the Energy Department's Robust Nuclear Earth Penetrator "bunker buster" and Advanced Concepts programs to various intelligence programs focusing on improving conventional bunker-buster capabilities. Rejected 204-214; R 11-207; D 192-7; I 1-0. May 20, 2004. Vote #203.

A vote yes is a (+).

3. 2005 Defense Authorization/Military Detainees

Waxman, D-Calif., motion to recommit the bill to the House Armed Services Committee with instructions to add language that would express the sense

of the House that a select committee should be established to investigate the treatment of detainees in the global war on terrorism, including allegations of abuse of Iraqi prisoners. Motion rejected 202-224; R 0-222; D 201-2; I 1-0. May 20, 2004. Vote #205.

A vote yes is a (+).

4. 2005 Energy and Water Appropriations/Global Threat Reduction

Meehan, D-Mass., amendment that would increase funding for the Global Threat Reduction initiative by \$30 million, while decreasing funding for nuclear weapons programs by the same amount. Rejected 150-236; R 7-196; D 142-40; I 1-0. June 25, 2004. Vote #323.

A vote yes is a (+).

5. 2005 Foreign Operations Appropriations/International Criminal Court

Nethercutt, R-Wash., amendment that would prohibit Economic Support Fund assistance to the government of any country that is a party to the International Criminal Court (ICC) and has yet to pledge it would not surrender U.S. nationals to the ICC. Adopted 241-166; R 201-11; D 40-154; I 0-1. July 15, 2004. Vote #387.

The Cost of War in Iraq

The total amount allocated for war and occupation in Iraq is approximately \$207.5 billion. This number is based on an analysis of a variety of documents indicating how much has been allocated for the war so far. Funding for the war has been initiated by the Bush Administration in four supplementals. The first supplemental request (FY2003 Supplemental: Operation Iraqi Freedom), made in March 2003, was for \$74.8 billion. Passed within a month of the request, the final allocation amounted to \$78.5 billion, at least \$54.4 billion of which was for the war in Iraq. The second supplemental request (FY2004 Supplemental: Iraq and Afghanistan Ongoing Operations/Reconstruction), for \$87 billion, was submitted in September 2003 and passed Congress in November 2003. The final allocation amounted to \$87.5 billion, of which \$70.6 billion was for Iraq. The third supplemental request (Budget Amendment: \$25 Emergency Reserve Fund (Department of Defense - Iraq Freedom Fund) was made in May 2004 and was passed by Congress as part of the Department of Defense appropriations bill in July 2004. Of the \$25 billion, \$21.6 billion was for the war in Iraq. The fourth supplemental request (Estimate #1 - Emergency Supplemental (various agencies): Ongoing Military Operations in the War on Terror; Reconstruction Activities in Afghanistan; Tsunami Relief and Reconstruction; and Other Purposes - 2/14/05) was made in February, 2005. It includes \$60.9 billion in additional funding for ongoing operations in Iraq.
